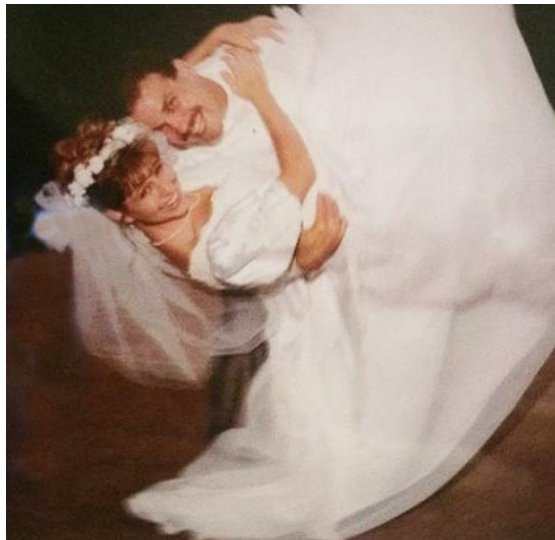

Nell reported on the Community Church's annual Back To School program, and related that a 12 year old girl was there, brought by her grandmother, wearing broken shower shoes, and mismatched worn out socks. A good reason to keep our charitable dollars in Keystone for Keystone's kids! Several Kiwanians helped out this year. The Church accepts clothing donations throughout the year, to be given to kids before they head back to school.

We are collecting school supplies for the next two weeks....these will be given to teachers at McRae School (Community School next time) to give to children who need them. Bring them to the first two meetings in August.

Tina reported that the Clay County Sheriff brought a Hummer for the kids to see at a recent Seeds of Grace community event. The shelter, that we contributed grant monies to help build (on land donated by Club member Jude), has become a community gathering place, with programs every Wednesday.

Smitty says that the Hampton Veterans Memorial Fund will be having a chili cookoff contest with live music on October 13. This is to erect a memorial at KHHS for fallen warriors who attended the school. We voted to donate \$100. Steve's band, "Bubba Can't Dance" is one of the bands. More details later.

Scott threw a \$2 bill into the Happy Dollar bucket....he had received an emergy text from John Ward, Clay County's Emergency Management head, about a skeeter that tested positive for West Nile on Pecan Street in Keystone. The City's Mayor, Karen Lake, did a FaceBook PSA and the County delivered door hangers to homes in the vicinity with suggestions to wear deet and long clothes. Spraying was done and the threat has passed.

Board of Directors News:
